
















### Wynnefield Community Rallies in **Opposition to More Proposed Medical** Marijuana Facilities

May 1, 2019 The Wynnefield Community held a protest rally against the oversaturation of medical marijuana dispensaries in the Wynnefield area.



There is a Cure Dispensary operating at 4502 City Ave next to the North American Motor lodge. The protest was staged at the second proposed location 5058 City Ave and the third proposed location is across from that one on City Ave on the Lower Merion side. There is the French International School nearby raising concerns about city and state proximity guidelines. State Representative Morgan Cephas, City Councilman Curtis Jones Jr. along with WRA President Mike Reid spearheaded the protest rally. The WRA and the Elected Officials are NOT opposed to medical marijuana advances, but do oppose too many dispensaries in the Wynnefield area and the concern of these dispensaries adding recreational sales to their menu, which will devastate Wynnefield's quality of life.
